

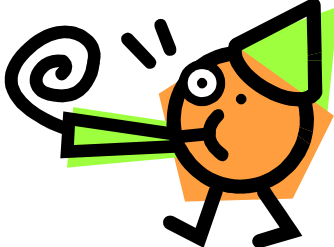

Meet NEW Member, Rtn. ADRIAN KING

Adrian T. King had a varied upbringing, the son of a Professor and Charity executive. He is half NYer, half Londoner by passport and passion. By blood: Italian, English with a drop of German. Born in Cairo but (was) moved to Greenwich Village, NYC as a toddler and spend his early youth there, followed by teenage years in Frankfurt Germany, in German, International and American schools there. A gap-year exchange program where he lived with a family from Padang in Jakarta for a year cemented his love for Indonesia, other emotions for Jakarta traffic and his parents preference for distance. This was followed by studies at the London School of Economics in the footsteps of John F. Kennedy and Mick Jagger...



Given the colorful geography of his upbringing, a similarly colorful career ensued... it started in Internet Venture Capital (when that was a good thing to do) and Leveraged Buy Outs (just before that was a great thing to do, but before it was a pretty bad thing to have done...). He did not like wearing ties as they reminded him of a noose but he did like the suits given his Italian and English blood. He took his Business Plan and finance skills and went out on his own, working with a diverse range of start ups: various music video / tech / advertising / technology production companies / agencies, a yacht racing charter company, a proposal to enter a new yacht in the Volvo Ocean Race, a

couture fashion magazine, a member bars, a boxing club and events company for Investment bankers to hit each other which raised over a US\$1m for grassroots charities. Some ventures worked, some didn't, so he also moonlighted for a number of private Investment funds in London, Frankfurt, Zurich and Monaco. He ended up as the business guy in Europe's leading talent and model agency with the brief to launch businesses for supermodels. He realized it didn't get much better than that in England but was still seeking more out of life so decided to move to SE Asia.

As luck would have it, he was hired by a veteran Resort Development project manager to be his 'right hand man'. However the Gentleman had a stroke a month after he arrived, leaving Adrian to PM the \$80m Resort project and act as Owner Representative. After moving on, he prepared a \$100m Resort development for funding. He lives in Oberoi, but will soon tire of Kampung Bule and is currently considering projects that would allow him to divide his time between a Balinese hut in the rice paddies and somewhere with skyscrapers and knishes. He speaks American, German, French, Indonesian and enough Balinese to be regularly offered Tuak.

Yayasan Anak-Anak (Bali Kids) by Brenton Whittaker



Rtn. Andrew introduced the Club's Guest Speaker, **Brenton Whittaker**, Project Coordinator for the **Yayasan Anak-Anak (Bali Kids)**, and student **Kadek Karyawan** (right).



Brenton started his informative talk by explaining that to date Yayasan Anak-Anak has helped over 4,000 poor Children, who live in very bad conditions, suffer from malnutrition and are in need of schooling.

* Bali Kids opened in April 2005 with the help of Ibu Yayuk Kanti. She stayed with Bali Kids until mid-2009 when it came time to focus on her own family.

Bali Kids provide a clean, safe environment for orphans requiring special care. The centre is open to any children registered in Bali's orphanages who need medical attention. Children from the local village whose family hold a 'poor family card' can also receive free treatment and care. Children needing to be hospitalised are provided pre and postoperative care at the centre. Short and long-term accommodation is available. In 2007, the clinic was named after Eran Svigos an Australian businesswoman and jewellery designer.



Brenton continued and told the Club that Bali Kids provide Hospital appointments, preparations and funding for surgery. Bali Kids is non-religious and accepts children from all orphanages on the island. The children's culture and background is always respected.

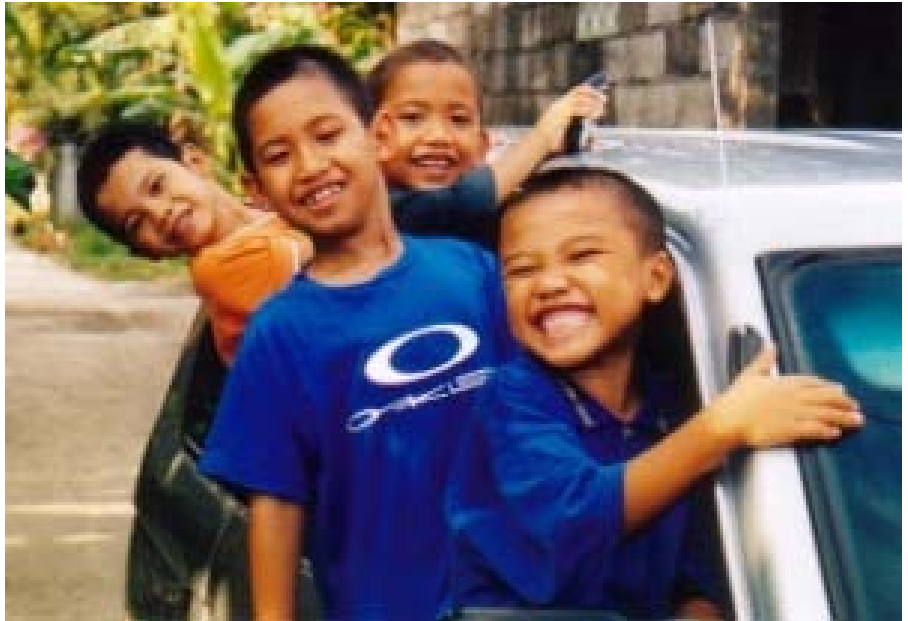
The Foundation Committee is headed by Stuart Smith, who is a well-respected Australian businessman in Bali. Stuart is passionate about helping the children of Bali and a major asset to the Foundation.

The remaining committee is made up of highly respected and skilled Balinese people. Dharma Putra is the Coordinator for the project and Nyoman Suartini the Medical Coordinator. Dr. Rismayanti heads the medical team for Bali Kids. Key members such as Trudy Mentink from Holland's Bali Bundar organisation, Robert Hincerick from the USA, Peter Janson and Nash from Prince Edward Island Canada, Kathy Orfanos, Vanessa Lowe, John & Keryn Begg, all from Australia and organizations such as The Carolia Foundation, Rotary, Variety, Gloria Jeans Coffee Kuta Square, Kartika Plaza Resort, Ahimsa Villas, Destination Asia, Oakley and Indonesian Pro Surf have been a great support for the project. Individuals from Australia, Belgium, Cambodia, Canada, Holland, Indonesia and the USA contribute enormously to the centre.

The mobile medical service operates 4 days per week and travels throughout Bali on a roster system. On average approximately 600 children are treated each month.

Our team educates Directors and staff of orphanages in preventative measures regarding hygiene, health and diet. This is supported by a book (Memulai Hidup Sehat) given to the staff and children following an informative lecture by our team. Bali Kids also visits local schools to provide this important information. Due to the preventative work carried out, our cases of scabies, other infectious conditions and health problems have greatly declined and general health improved. Our medical team has forged a strong relationship with the orphanages and the children are more forthcoming with personal health issues.

One additional vehicle was donated in 2009 to enable Bali Kids to service the orphanages more efficiently. 18 are of land has been recently purchased with a view to build a new purpose built centre by 2011.



The centre will include a dental surgery to be operated by the Australian dental charity 'Senyum' and volunteer dentists from Australia and Holland.

The centre will accommodate 30 children in fulltime care and room for up to 30 children from outside orphanages requiring medical care. The centres are currently in separate locations which is not ideal.

The children are provided computer, English, mathematics at the orphanage and other subjects. Older children have vocational training opportunities. Currently two children are studying in Australia on scholarships which are supported by their respective schools, sponsors and Carry For Kids Inc.

The projects **long-term plan** is to offer orphans scholarships to study dentistry, medicine, nursing, accounting and computer studies. The scholarship program will commence when funding becomes available. The project will continue to focus on education and prevention in relation to health and social issues for the orphans. Bali Kids will provide holistic care for the children and accept children from any religious background. Bali Kids encourages the children to embrace their culture and the religion of their choice.
