**Nev Doidge** is a Western Representative, qualified Social Worker and Drug Alcohol Practitioner, Counselor, also the founder of a successful drug and alcohol rehabilitation center here in Bali and now founder of the Movement of Recovery (MOR) Project.

**Bimbim-** Keuta Yayasan Semangat Pergerakan Pemulihan: The Chairman of MOR Project and a Balinese who experienced recovery, then his passion became to help others. He also has a huge empath and experience in business management.

**The Movement of Recovery** project, started in January, 2018, is a team of persons in recovery and mental health professionals, who dedicate themselves to promoting positive lifestyle choices. Together they strive to further the growth of mental health services in Bali, and Indonesia, continuing to break the stigma attached to mental health issues and educate communities. MOR Project began undertaking projects specifically designed to further the growth of recovery from substance addiction in Indonesia. Since 2020, they have been undertaking food relief efforts with Crisis Kitchen while conducting mental health assessments and collaborating with other mental health professionals to provide mental health support and service inclusive to all (English and Indonesian speaking) suffering from mental health issues.

In November 2020, MOR Project together with a professional mental health team (Berteman Biak) built a collaborative

network of 11 mental Health NGOs (11 NGO Collaborative) supporting the well-being of Bali and minority groups, spiritually, mentally, emotionally and physically with inclusivity.

L.I.S.A- Love Inside Suicide Awareness is the first help-line center for suicide prevention, which was launched on April 6, 2021 for broad spectrum mental health issues to lessen the suicide rate in Bali and Indonesia. The goal is to have by the end of 2021, LISA helpline running 24/7 with systems in place to provide emergency help and a secure safe environment with professional care at the Bali Bersama Bisa (BBB) Community Health Center.

There have been 73 Indonesians and 15 English speaking volunteers through the MOR training, since Oct. 2020.

Presently, MOR Project is looking for a suitable location in Bali. Two offices and a space for support groups to begin is required. MOR Project can operate and provide mental health care services and other projects at an expense of IDR 33,500,000 per month.

The motto of MOR is “Enjoy Not Endure”
