Jiwa Community Garden, Canggu

Secretary Anita introduced the guest speakers Lenny and Krishna from the Jiwa Community Garden. Located in Canggu on 48 are of land Jiwa productive gardens features communal and sponsored garden plots with regenerative agricultural practices with free-range egg production and community food donations with SOS (Scholars for Subsentence) and included animals in the ecosystem plan. Jiwa Gardens showcases profitable organic farming for local youth making a bridge between local and expats residents in the community. Krishna is the green entrepreneur and land caretaker of the project. Lenny is in charge of External Affairs and Djuca (who could not come to the meeting) is the Garden Expert in teaching permaculture.

The Mission of Jiwa Community Garden is to preserve and teach local agricultural wisdom, provide training for a secure future and jobs in Bali's eco sector. Thus, this mission is to inspire people to connect to their food and ecosystems through permaculture workshops, courses, a space for community events all build with 100% bamboo and recycled materials.

One of the main needs of the group is compost/ organic waste. 70% of Bali's waste is organic. Compost heroes pick up food scraps and garden trimmings turning 200 kg. of apparent waste into fertile soil daily. Every day the group is composting Canggu market's waste for free.

The green oasis of this site is also a spot to gather, connect and unwind. Jiwa Garden sessions are every 1st ad 3rd Saturday to help and learn in the garden. Jiwa Café served local dishes cooked with the garden ingredients.

The total funding for Jiwa Gardens needed is IDR 200 million of which IDR 130 would be used for organic waste storage and a processing building made from bamboo and aluminum roofing. IDR 45 million is needed for a three-wheeler pick up for organic waste pick-ups from the markets.
