Lastly, Rtn. Florian took the members through the various steps on how to sponsor a new member. These included the following:

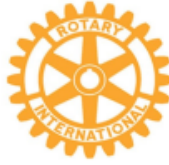
- Method of Electing Members 2021 – 2022

P Patrick thanked Rtn. Florian for his very informative presentation and then reminded the members of what **RI President Shekhar Mehta** said at the beginning of July:

*“Let this be a year of changemakers, and let us begin with our membership. That is precisely why the **Each One, Bring One initiative** is so important. During this year, I urge you to dream of new ways in which Rotary can expand its reach into your community and therefore the world. If each member introduces one person to Rotary, our membership can increase to 1.3 million by July 2022. So, let’s just do it.”*

Lastly, P Patrick asked the participants to share their ideas about some new programs / projects that the RCBS could pursue to make the club a more VIBRANT one and to attract new members. Here are some of the suggestions / ideas / recommendations that were offered:

1. The RCBS needs to ask itself – WHY would community members WANT to join our Rotary Club?
2. What type of programs / projects / activities would be interesting for potential new members?



3. Does the club need to make a short, eye-catching video encouraging perspective members to join the RCBS.

P Patrick then asked the members to do some brainstorming and come up with some COVID-19 ideas / projects the RCBS could engage in during this Rotary year.

1. Individual club members should consider helping people with their food cost / boarding house rents / motorcycle payments.
2. Distribute food to the needy.
3. Train people to become entrepreneurs and / or gain NEW job skills.
4. Pay for vaccines.
5. Pay for BPJS monthly bills
6. Pay school fees.
7. Pay for oxygen.
8. Aid people with mental health issues.
9. Consider writing a District Grant to help the poor.
10. Support D3420 with their COVID-19 initiatives.

P Patrick THANKED all the participants for joining the meeting and said the RCBS will continue to support struggling / unlucky community members whenever possible.
