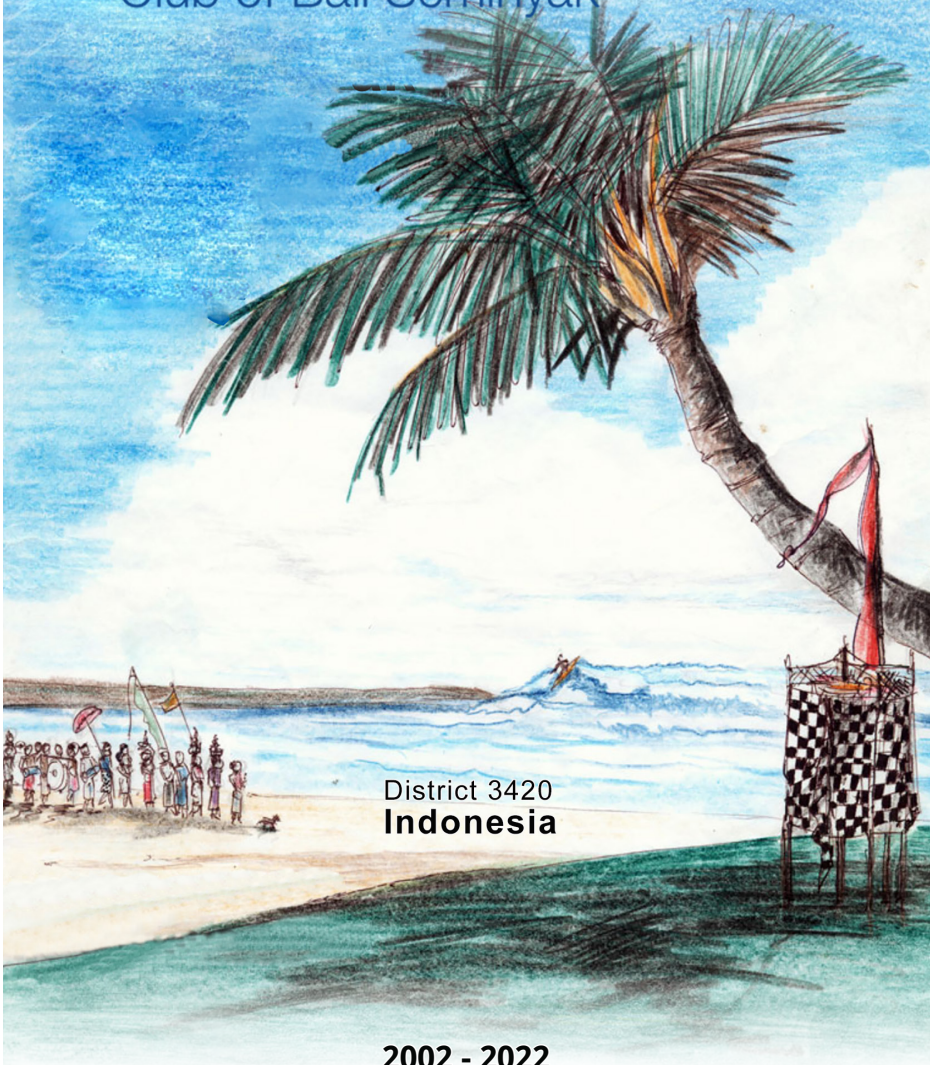

IN A TIME OF CRISIS, LIFE GOES ON...

Welcome to the latest news from Rotary Club Bali Seminyak (RCBS). There have been dramatic changes in our club since our last published message. Our calm environment has been rattled by Mt. Agung's volcanic eruptions. Despite its eruptions... we just don't when or even if in the meantime, RCBS has responded by delivering dozens of water filters to evacuation camps, collecting monetary donations and coordinating with other Rotary clubs in all through a District Rotary Committee led by Rotary Club Bali Kuta.

Over a hundred thousand villagers have been evacuated from their homes and are now living in tents, or with family or friends. Throughout Bali, the land of a thousand temples, every village is holding special temple ceremonies dedicated to calming the mountain and bringing all of us safe.

The project RCBS continues with some amazing youth, especially supported by the...

The Puhu Global Grant, focused on water, sanitation and hygiene, is moving right along and over 500 children have been benefited by the local Government Clinic (Puskemas). Doctors, dentists, nurses and technicians check children from head to toe...including vision screening! Where a health problem was identified, the clinic will follow-up with parents.

Another batch of 600 reading books was delivered to an elementary school in Tabanan. There simply are not enough government supplied books that entice children to read. In this rural culture, it is so important to get our young peoples' cute little noses into books!

Thanks to the generosity of the Australian Consulates' Direct Aid Program (DAP), RCBS is competing with many other clubs and organizations for project funding. RCBS

is proud and privileged to serve with Rotary Club Bali Seminyak and its members. The 2009-2010 program is a 4-month accelerated program with a complete Rotary Club team. The team includes a local member, two job placement coordinators and the Rotary Club of Nusa Dua. We will also be human made with a bus to transport the women from the changes to the training program and a truck for the bigger projects for recycling waste, the village Mike and RCBS meeting continued sustainability of its projects to be carried on with the devoted team at RCBS, at the heart.

Founded in 2009 provides surgical operations to over 1,400 children and adults in Bali, Lombok and Flores for cleft lip and cleft palate and disabilities. The free facilities include the family in stay for the children and the surgical procedures for the children with follow-up operations and medical treatment in Australia.

When I ask strangers or friends if they are familiar with Rotary, they often respond that it is not a club or religious organization, but actually one of the world's first service clubs founded by an American attorney, Paul Harris in Chicago and formed in 1905. It was originally intended to be an organization for professionals of diverse backgrounds to exchange ideas, form meaningful, lifelong friendships with the intention of giving back to their communities. Rotary's name came from the group's early practice of rotating meetings among the offices of its members.

Little did the founding fathers of Rotary realize that it would become an organization of men and women today with 1.2 million members to over 32,000 Rotary Clubs in more than 200 countries and 100,000 districts. Whether traveling to another country, it can usually find a Rotary Club with an open invitation and warm welcome to join their meeting. I have been to meetings all over the world from Beverly Hills, California to Nairobi, Kenya. Almost every year the world has a Rotary Club and maybe one or two in one city.

The 114 years of Rotary with the formation of the Rotary International in 1917, has made it a historical impact in the world with members such as Thomas Edison, Charles Lindbergh, Sir Winston Churchill, Albert Schweitzer, Franklin D. Roosevelt, Buzz Aldrin, John F. Kennedy, right up to a present with Bill and Melinda Gates working with the Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation.

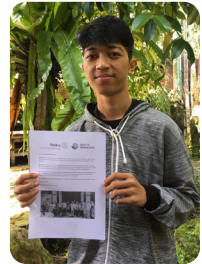

The Rotary Club of Bali Seminyak Celebrates 20 Years of Service to the Community



The Rotary Club of Bali Seminyak (RCBS) which was chartered on 14 May 2002 will be celebrating its 20th Anniversary on 19 June 2022 with 350 – 400 underprivileged people living in a landfill and recycling area of Legian near the Jln. Nakula and Jln. Sunset Rd. junction.

A buffet luncheon will be served from 10:00 – 14:00 so that the club members and their friends can spend some time together with local community members. After our guests have finished their lunch, they will be given an opportunity to select some clothing donated by the **SMILE Foundation** and bags from **BIWA** and take home a 'SEMBAKO' package.

This will be a unique way for the RCBS to celebrate its 20th Anniversary – having lunch together with underprivileged community members while remembering Rotary's motto: 'Service Above Self.'

Why feed the underprivileged in the Legian area?

With the onset of the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, the prevalence of malnutrition in Bali became high, both in rural and urban areas. With the downturn in tourism, a significant portion of people in Bali fell into very difficult times. In response to this need, the RCBS initiated a FOOD program that included distribut-

ing small packaged meals called 'Nasi Jinggo' and 'Nasi Bungkus' on Jln. Sunset Rd. This quickly evolved into distributing grocery bags called 'SEMBAKOs' to needy people in several recycling areas in Legian.

From September 2021 to May 2022 nearly 5,000 meals and food supplies were distributed to workers and their families living in poor areas.

Due to the generosity of several donors, one being **P.T. Soejasch Bali**, the RCBS' food program has been a great success.

The Rotary Club of Bali Seminyak is one of six English-speaking clubs with 30 members among the 32 clubs in Bali.

Over the past 20 years, the RCBS has implemented 14 Global Grants with substantial impactful funding with International Partners and in collaboration with the Rotary Foundation for projects in Bali, Flores, Halmahera, Sumba, and Sumbawa. In addition, there have been more than a dozen District Grants for a variety of communities around Bali. The club projects with sole club funding are many. Projects have ranged working with notable NGOs in Bali and club-initiated projects.

2021 – 2022 FOOD DISTRIBUTION PROGRAM

The coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic and measures to contain it have measurable hurt the tourism-based economy on the island of Bali. Despite the implementation of an emergency fiscal stimulus package and temporary social assistance programs to support low-income families, by the government, many poor families still struggle to live.

A significant portion of the local community is earning no more than US\$ 36 per month. Many people in Bali fell into poverty during the pandemic.



In response, the Rotary Club of Bali Seminyak has initiated a Covid-19 Relief & Response Fund as well as an informative news section to their website during the beginning of the second half of year 2021. <https://rotaryseminyak.org/covid19>

As an important part of our COVID-19 Response & Relief efforts, our Community Food Distribution program to date gave out nearly 3,000 meals to our local communities, where we fortnightly distribute packaged meals called



‘Nasi Bungkus’, containing a freshly cooked assortment of food such as chicken, vegetables, egg, noodles, and rice.

With the support of major private and corporate donors, we have recently expanded our food distribution program where we deliver food, meals and other donations to workers of landfills and recycling areas in the Legian area that often live on site. Here, our volunteer club members ventured to designated I



cations to personally distributed hundreds of meal packages, called ‘Sembako’ which have been either prepared by our club or received as donation from our partners and donors.

To date, the RCBS has raised more than ca. Rp. 150,000,000 in cash donations and non-cash (food) contributions from Club members, associates of members and private and corporate donors.

RCBS is thanking all Club members, private and corporate donors for their generous support of this community project.

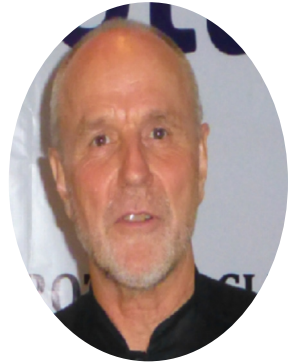
